Dr. Nilima Dutta, besides being an academician, was a poet, novelist, writer of children books, translator, biographer and a columnist, at a stretch. Some of her novels were Akash Banti, Shaila Shikhar, Pran Sikha, Vidyut Prava, Aparajita, Dhumuhar Pichat, etc. Nilima Dutta had three collections of poetry to her credit. Surar Chabi aru Pranar Sur, Shesh Nai, Andhakup, Prabhakar and Bahagar Aranya were the titles of her anthologies of poetry. Then, for the children readers also Dutta authored books titled Mahapurush Sankardeva, Moi aru Ami, Mahat Lokar

Larali Kaal and Shisu aru Suna Katha. She translated Will Durant's Story of Philosophy and S. Radhakrishnan's Kalki. While she wrote a biography on the life of her husband Bhabnranda Dutta, her autobiographical work was titled Luitare Pani Jabi O' Boi.
