arali Sharma born on 4th August, 1974, is a singer, composer and a music director, whose success in the music world in all these three capacities, that too at such a young age, is a real cause of pride for the people of Assam. Tarali, indeed created history in the world of Assamese music by winning the 1st National award in the category of playback singing in the year 2003-04 for the film Akashi Torar Kathare directed by Manju Borah. Tarali also composed the music of the film for which she had to undextake extensive research as the background score was based on the various folk and music traditions of the ethnic communities such as the Bodo and the Rajbongshi tribes of Assam. Laaz (2004), Let's Dance (Hindi 2009), Basundhara (2009) are the three other pathbreaking films in which Tarali did the background score and composed the music as well. She did the music for a telefilm named *Ejoni Japani Sowali* (Manju Borah) for which she had to do extensive research on Japanese traditional music. She also scored the music of a few documentaries both in Assamese and in English like Jyotirgamaya (2005) which was telecast on NDTV, Profit, Echoes of Sunshine ('07) and And Thus Flows the River Brahmaputra (2010). So far she has composed the music and rendered her voice for as many as eight music albums, besides being a very successful playback-singer in a large number of Assamese films. Tarali is even associated with a noted mobile theatre group in Assam, Kohinoor Theatre.
