

In Conversation with Dr. Pori Hiloidari

An Associate Professor in the Department of English of Handique Girls' College, Dr. Pori Hiloidari is a known figure in the field of Assamese critical writings. A bilingual writer, Dr. Hiloidari has published numerous articles on various aspects of literary criticism both in English and Assamese in edited books and magazines including Assamese magazines like Gariyashi and Prakash. She has edited books like Assamese Women: The Pathbreakers in 2011, Govinda

Prasad Sarma: The Person, Personality and Writings in 2013, Female Author-ity: Women's Short Story Writing in Assamese (1980-2015) in 2021. In conversation with her, we had the opportunity to talk about her ideas on the genre of translation and her other literary pursuits.

To start off we would like to congratulate you once again on your achievement. Thank you for bringing pride and honour to Handique Girls' College and to all of us here. We have always known you as a bilingual writer and a critic. We would like to know how your journey as a translator began.

PH Being a bilingual writer, I have to engage myself very often in the act of negotiating between English and Assamese and that must have encouraged me to take the task of translation seriously. Initially I thought that translation was not my cup of tea. But later when I was offered by a publisher the work of translating Mamang Dai's novel, its unconventional style of narration immediately caught my attention and as I decided to translate, it really turned out to be an immensely rewarding experience. My area of interest is literary criticism but even there you cannot escape the problematic of translation, particularly when some critical idioms and concepts do not have any equivalent terms in your own language. There is also the question of acceptability of newly coined terms by the larger community of readers and critics. Keeping these things in perspective, the need to nurture translation of works from the regional to the global language and the other way around demands our generous investment of time, effort and will.

Mamang Dai's "The Legends of Pensam" was published in 2006. In 2017 she received Sahitya Akademi for the novel *The Black Hill.* Why did you select "The Legends of Pensam" for translation into Assamese?

PH: The Legends of Pensam is a fictional representation

of the crisis of identity experienced by the tribes and communities of Arunachal Pradesh, living at the crossroads of modernity and tradition. It is to be noted that Mamang Dai writes about the unique native world of the tribes and their worldview in a language which is not her mother tongue. The folk content of the novel is emotionally distant from the elite character of the English language. It is interesting to note that even Mamang Dai must have

faced the problem of inadequacy of appropriate words and expressions, as is indicated by the use of the word pensam in the title of the novel. The problematic of translation is not unique to the translators alone. As far as Assamese language is concerned, it is not possible to find mathematical equation between their cultural geography and our linguistic register and even then, the bridging of gap through translation becomes all the more exciting. The problematic of translation is not unique to the translators alone. That is why Salman Rushdie says that we are all translated beings. We translate culture, thoughts and ideas. We translate from the spoken to the written and vice versa. As our everyday life consists of telling and retelling stories, translation is a continuous process.

You have been involved with activities related to translation for a long time. Is translation a very instinctive process or are there specific ways of doing it?

PH: Translation is an instinctive process. Sometimes you may not feel any urge to translate a very easy work written in ordinary prose, but sometimes a difficult work might tempt you to take the challenge of translation and to share the pleasure with your readers. You see, each chapter in my translated work *The Legends of Pensam* begins with short verse prologues. I did not even try to translate those lines and as I was working on the novel's chapters, some very striking stanzas in Nabakanta Barua's poems flashed in my mind and instead of translating Mamang Dai's short verse prologues into Assamese, I incorporated those lines by Nabakanta Baruah; that is how, I believe, instinct works in the act of translation.

Do you feel more comfortable translating one genre of writing versus the others? Which genre poses more challenges to you as a translator?

PH: It is not that I have tried my hands in all genres of



literature. Actually, selection of a work for translation depends on the text, not on the genre. It is the level of difficulty in the language, layers of underlying meanings and the nuances in the work that determine the type of challenge that you face. Difficulty is not genre-specific. I

have till now translated a biography and a novel into Assamese and a handful of poems into English. Sometimes translation of poetry is so thrilling, because maintaining the rhythm and poetic essence in another language gets possible only through deep intuitive engagement and hard work. Academic writings are apparently easy to translate but non-availability of discipline-specific vocabulary poses a major difficulty; similarly, colloquial language in fictional literature makes the task of translation a challenging task.

You have been teaching in Handique Girls' College from 1996 onwards. Do you think your teaching experience has in any way contributed towards the role of a translator?

PH: I do believe that teaching and translating literature are not mutually exclusive but complementary activities and this is more so in view of the widening of the term 'English literature' to include regional literatures in translation in the courses and programmes under the CBCS system of Higher Education. Teachers and students of literature are reaping the benefits of this paradigm shift in favour

of translation. It is an immensely satisfying experience when you see that young undergraduate students doing the Translation Studies paper are translating some of our regional works into English with lots of enthusiasm. It might sound paradoxical, but sometimes translation


makes the original text easier to understand. I would like to give you an example: Eminent modern Assamese poet Ajit Baruah's poem "Xuoni Amar Gaukhon Oti" (a modern parody of another very famous Assamese poem) is difficult to understand in Assamese as we are not familiar with some words and expressions which have become obsolete by now. But the poem's translated version in English with editorial footnotes has made the task of reading and decoding an exciting experience.

We would like to know what other projects are you working on presently?

PH: My book of literary criticism on few path-breaking Assamese novels titled Path Pratipath Nirman

Binirman is going to be published by Papyrus next month. I am presently working on a book of critical essays on contemporary Assamese short stories. Apart from that I keep writing book reviews and articles on literary criticism for newspapers and literary magazines.
